# TYPES OF CONSTRUCTION IBC Chapter 6

- Building Elements (Primary Structural Frame, Walls, Floor and Roof) are of non-combustible construction and have a 3-hour rating. Commonly these are high rise or very large low-rise concrete buildings. Type IA-
- Building Elements (Primary Structural Frame, Walls, Floor and Roof ) are of non-combustible construction and have a 2-hour rating. Commonly these are high rise or very large low-rise concrete buildings.
- Building Elements (Primary Structural Frame, Walls, Floor and Roof ) are of non-combustible construction and have a 1-hour rating. Commonly these are high rise or very large low-rise concrete buildings. Type IIA-
- Building Elements (Primary Structural Frame, Walls, Floor and Roof ) are of non-combustible construction and have a 0-hour rating. Commonly these are high rise or very large low-rise concrete buildings. Type IIB-
- Exterior walls are of noncombustible material and have a 2-hour rating, interior elements can be of any material (Primary Structural Frame, Interior Load Bearing Walls, Floor and Roof must have a 1-hour rating. Exterior walls must have a 2-hour rating) Type IIIA-
- Most commonly these are buildings with concrete or masonry exterior walls but with wood frame floor, interior wall and roof.
- Exterior walls are of noncombustible material and have a 2-hour rating, structural members are allowed to have a 0-Hour Rating.
- Most commonly these are buildings with concrete or masonry exterior walls but with wood frame floor, interior wall and roof.
- Heavy Timber. Exterior walls are of non-combustible construction and interior building elements are of solid wood, laminated wood, heavy timber All types of materials are allowed. Interior and Exterior load-bearing walls, floors, roofs and all structural members are protected to provide a or Structural Composite Lumber Type VA-Type IV-
