- CM Policy 103 (Effective 8/2/18)

Records Management

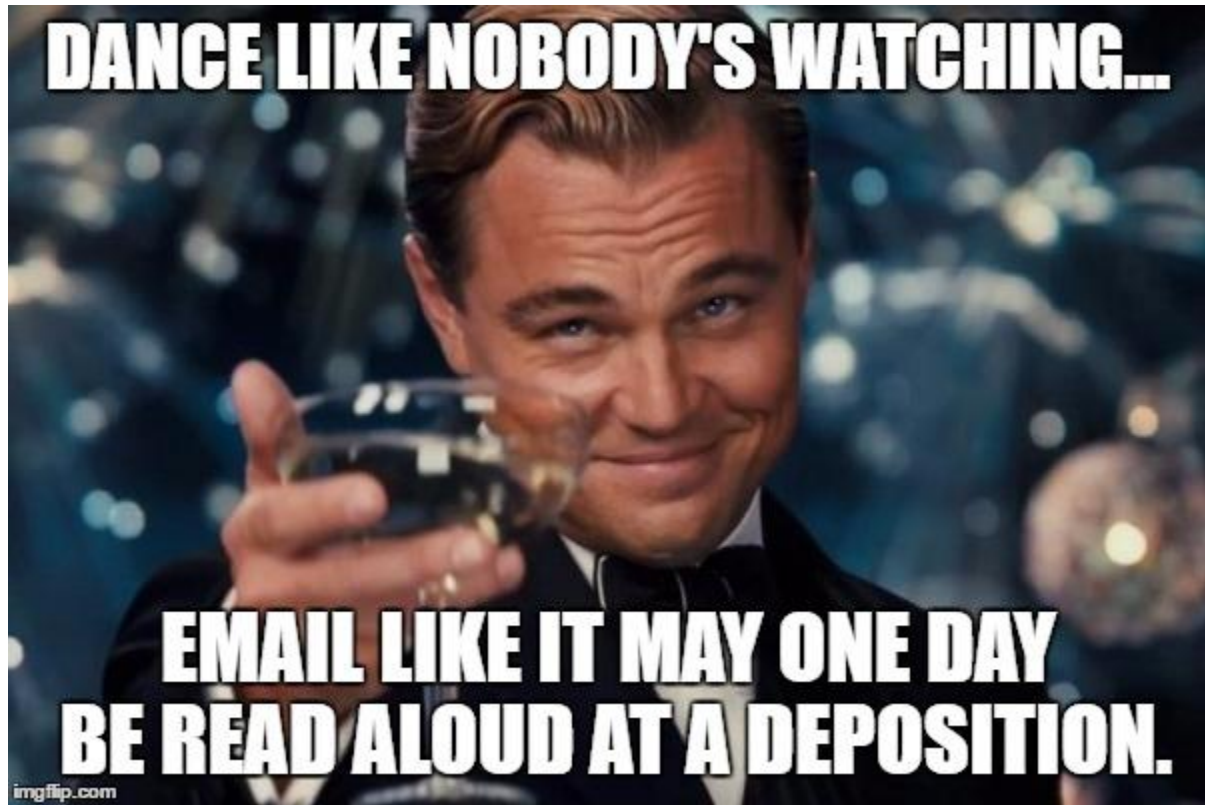
- City of Reno Public Records System
 - Online Payments launched March 2018
 - Reno Police Department launched April 2018
 - 2018: Processed 11,587 requests
 - 2019: On track to process **16,392 requests**
 - (8,196 requests through Q2)
 - Significant growth due to increased access, flourishing economy, and centralization
 - Fulfilling primary goals of transparency and access

- Nevada Supreme Court Case
- Public records electronically stored on private devices, accounts and systems are not categorically exempt from public disclosure under the Nevada Public Records Law. See, *Comstock Residents Assn. v. Lyon County Bd. of Commissioners*, 414 P.3d 318 (Nev. 2018).
- Your PERSONAL phone may be discoverable
- PRR Training and Test (employees)


Things To Know

- Your emails may public record
 - Calendars
 - Agendas
 - Notes
- Forwarding Attorney/Client Emails is not a “best practice”
- Text messages may be public record

Public Records Training

Public records electronically stored on private devices, accounts or systems of City officers and employees are categorically exempt from public disclosure under the Nevada Public Records Law because the City does not have legal custody or control of these records.

Public Records Training

Public records include information created or received by the City:

- a) Pursuant to federal, state or local law.
- b) In connection with the transaction of the official business of any City elected or appointed officer.
- c) In connection with the transaction of the official business of any City office, department, board, commission, committee, subcommittee or council.
- d) In connection with the provision of a public service.
- e) All of the above.

Public Records Training

A person who willfully and unlawfully removes, alters, mutilates, destroys, conceals or obliterates a record, map, book, paper, document or other thing filed or deposited in a public office, or with any public officer, by authority of law, is guilty of:

- a) A misdemeanor for each public record destroyed.
- b) A \$500 civil penalty for each public record destroyed.
- c) A category C felony.
- d) A category D felony if malicious.
- e) All of the above.
