Parks and Recreation | General Fund

- COVID-19 pandemic caused a significant economic downturn
- Departments were requested to submit 5% | 10% | 15% reductions

Parks and Recreation | Reduction Strategies

- 1. Eliminate boards & commission donation funds before cutting programs.
- 2. Eliminate contracts not related to core services, instead of laying off employees.
- 3. Return to core services. Eliminate or reduce non-core service programs.
- 4. All Divisions, provide basic services, reduce or eliminate enhanced programs/services.
- 5. Parks/Urban Forestry needs remain and don't have facilities to close to reduce expenses/work load. Avoid cuts when possible.
- 6. Youth Services is the highest revenue generating program area. Avoid cuts when possible.
- 7. Hold positions vacant.
- 8. Reduction in force.

Parks and Recreation Total: \$310,952

- ➤ Non-City Programs/Donations (Youth) \$10,000
 Eliminate YCC Funding
 Potential Impact: Eliminates the funding to host the Youth City Council
- Non-City Programs/Donations (Inclusion) \$20,000
 Eliminate Reno Access Advisory Committee donation funds
 Potential Impact: Committee donations to community organizations/events would be eliminated, but services provided by the Advisory Committee would be minimally impacted
- Outside Services Other (Health & Wellness) \$24,000 Cancellation of Ambassador Productions catering contact Potential Impact: Reschedule events around typical meal times. This is the entire cost of the contract. Proposing eliminating the contract as there are plans for more efficient service provision.
- Outside Services Other (Health & Wellness) \$9,000
 Cut transportation buses for senior trips
 Potential Impact: A vast majority of trips are cancelled due to the pandemic



> Reduction in Force - .25 FTE (Health & Wellness) \$19,000

Cut temp staff impacting all trips and external recreational activities

<u>Potential Impact:</u> A vast majority of the trips we would be taking citizens on have been cancelled for the foreseeable future so staffing is not necessary

Outside Services – Other (Health & Wellness) \$9,690

Cut high cost events for senior games

<u>Potential Impact:</u> Reduces number of events offered. Impacts Go Kart racing, Golf, Bowling, Skiing, Snowboarding, Escape room

Outside Services – Other (Health & Wellness) \$6,000

Eliminate senior dances

Potential Impact: Due to the pandemic, these events are not advised

Reduce Temp Salaries (Athletics) \$3,840

Reduce temp salaries for basketball

<u>Potential Impact:</u> Due to the pandemic, Temporary salaries no longer needed due to the cancellation of one of the three adult basketball seasons

Outside Services – Other (Athletics) \$6,996

Reduce budget for basketball referees

<u>Potential Impact:</u> Officials no longer needed due to the cancellation of an adult basketball season



> Temp Salaries (Youth) \$3,307

Reduce bus driver budget

Potential Impact: Bus Driver Temp Salaries due to camp field trip reductions

Outside Services – Other (Youth) \$5,613

Reduce/Eliminate Camp Field Trip Admissions.

Potential Impact: Due to the pandemic, camp field trips have been reduced/cancelled

➤ Outside Services – Other (Admin) \$6,000

Eliminate transcription services for all department commissions

Potential Impact: Department staff will need to transcribe commission meetings

Travel/Training (Admin) \$2,350

Reduce travel and training budget

<u>Potential Impact:</u> Conferences and trainings not related to continued certifications that will likely be delayed or cancelled

➤ Vacant Position – Horticulturalist (Parks Maintenance) \$144,806

Attrition vacancy – hold position open.

Potential Impact: Eliminate basket program effective 7/1/20



Supplies (Parks Maintenance) \$7,500

Eliminate budget for greenhouse.

<u>Potential Impact:</u> Requires the closure of the greenhouse

Supplies (Parks Maintenance) \$3,100

Eliminate supplies for hanging baskets

Potential Impact: Eliminate hanging basket program

➤ Supplies (Parks Maintenance) \$2,500

Holiday decorations

Potential Impact: Eliminate holiday decoration resupply

Supplies (Forestry) \$1,000

Reduce tree equip repairs 50%.

Potential Impact: May require waiting before replacing equipment

➤ Outside Services – Other (Golf) \$20,000

Money is used for the upkeep of the grounds including repairs for the clubhouse and structures owned by the City.

Potential Impact: Needed repairs may be delayed

Outside Services – Other (Parks Maintenance) \$6,250

Reduce budget for replacement power tools

Potential Impact: May delay replacement for tools used for park maintenance



Parks and Recreation | Room Tax

Adopted Budget: Transferred to Parks Maintenance	\$1,450,000
Reduce FY21 Council Projects	\$(450,000)
Reduce FY20 transfer to Affordable Housing	\$(443,000)
Reduce FY21 transfer to GF for Special Events	\$(265,000)



- Complete shutdown March; except for parks and open space
 - had to place approximately 368 temporary part-time employees into temporarily layoff status
 - Allowed staff to stay on payroll
 - Allowed eligible staff to file for unemployment benefits
- Slowly reopened later in the spring according to Governor directives and CDC guidelines




- Parks, Open Space & Trails
 - Restrooms
 - Outdoor courts
 - Skate parks
 - Athletic fields (practices only)
 - Playgrounds (not recommended)



- All recreation facilities that are open must operate under strict COVID guidelines.
- COVID screening includes temperature and symptom checks and masks must be worn at all times.
- Rigorous and frequent cleaning schedules.
- All programs are operating at reduced capacity.
- All programs require pre-registration or reservations.
