# 5 Presentation by Adam Searcy, Chief Facilities Management Officer, on the Washoe County School District Facility Planning

(Commissioner Velto present at 6:05 p.m.)

Adam Searcy, WCSD, gave an overview of the WCSD Facility Plan and answered questions from commissioners.

Mr. Searcy explained for Commissioner Marshall that the facilities plan is tied to student enrollment and district funding from the State is also tied to enrollment.

Angela Fuss, Acting Community Development Director, confirmed for Commissioner Marshall that the school district's next facilities plan can come to the Reno Planning Commission for review and input. She also explained that it is reviewed by the Regional Planning Commission as well.

Mr. Searcy explained for Commissioner Johnson that they are working on a revitalization plan that looks at anticipated needs for existing facilities.

#### **6** Public Hearings

6.1 Staff Report (For Possible Action): Case No. LDC21-00014 (River Bend Power Line Relocation) - A request has been made for special use permits to allow for: a) the relocation of an overhead 120 kilovolt (kV) powerline; and b) development adjacent to residential zoning. This is considered a project of regional significance because it involves the relocation of a utility line with the capacity to carry 60 kV of electricity or more (120 kV). The ±22.13 acre site consists of five parcels located south of Highway 40, starting ±330 feet west of its intersection with Edinburgh Drive, running east for ±0.4 miles. The site is within the Single-Family Residential -6,000 (SF-6) and Community Commercial (CC) zones and has Single-Family Neighborhood (SFN) and Suburban Mixed Use (SMU) Master Plan land use designations. John Krmpotic, KLS Design Group, gave an overview of the project.

Nathan Gilbert, Associate Planner, presented the staff report. Staff recommends approval with the conditions listed in the staff report.

**Public Comment:** 

Comments from NV Energy were received, provided to the Commission and entered into the record. No other public comment or voice mails were received.

Questions:

Mr. Krmpotic confirmed for Commissioner Marshall that the applicant is the developer. This is not an NV Energy led application.

Commissioner Marshall asked why they want to relocate the line.

Mr. Krmpotic stated the applicant is preparing the property for future development.

Commissioner Johnson asked what the required setback is around a line of this voltage.

Mr. Gilbert stated the requirement is 150 foot separation from the footprint of a residential structure.

Discussion:

Commissioner Marshall stated that relocating the power line will have a significant increase in terms of the interference with views from one of the most heavily used bike routes we have. Going from a smaller power line to a larger more complex power line is a significant impact. He discussed the costs for undergrounding. This is an opportunity for us to avoid a circumstance where the public would bear some of the burden to allow a developer to realize profit.

Commissioner Velto asked Commissioner Marshall what finding that applies to.

Commissioner Marshall stated finding b and finding f would apply.

Commissioner Velto asked the applicant to weigh in on Commissioner Marshall's concern.

Mr. Krmpotic addressed the visual impact issue. We are relocating an existing corridor. The fact that we are eliminating a corridor should be of some benefit. There is an H frame structure going through the site today that has more visual impact than there would be with a single pole.

Commissioner Marshall stated the H frame goes through the parcel and crosses the roadway, it doesn't parallel the roadway like the proposed relocation would.

Commissioner Velto explained his concern with applying finding f to an environmental aesthetic.

Commissioner Marshall stated general aesthetics and scenic quality is in fact a recognized environmental impact.

Chair Taylor stated she is having a hard time not making the finding since there is already an existing power line there.

Commissioner Gower stated he understands where Commissioner Marshall is coming from and he does consider finding f to cover the aesthetic impact issue. There is an existing power line in this area and he sees this as a consolidation of infrastructure and a net improvement in the overall amount of infrastructure on the landscape.

Commissioner Johnson agreed with the comments by Chair Taylor and Commissioner Gower regarding the existing line. The eastern portion of the site does not have a power line and this would be an intensification but there is a utility corridor that makes this property not viable for much development. He does not believe this creates adverse environmental impacts.

It was moved by Commissioner Munoz, seconded by Commissioner Gower, in the case of LDC21-00014 (River Bend Power Line Relocation), based upon compliance with the applicable findings, to approve the special use permit subject to the conditions listed in the staff report. Motion carried with five (5) in favor and one (1) opposition by Commissioner Marshall.
