

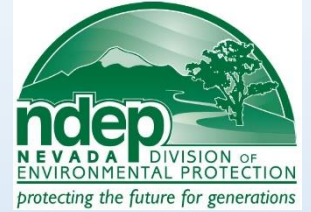

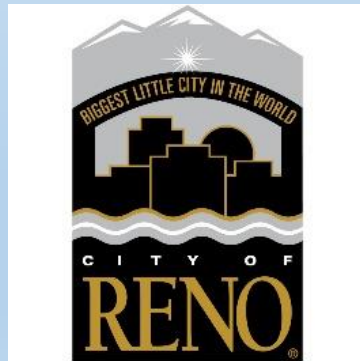

4. Ensure the measurable, sustainable and collaborative management of the river for today and into the future.

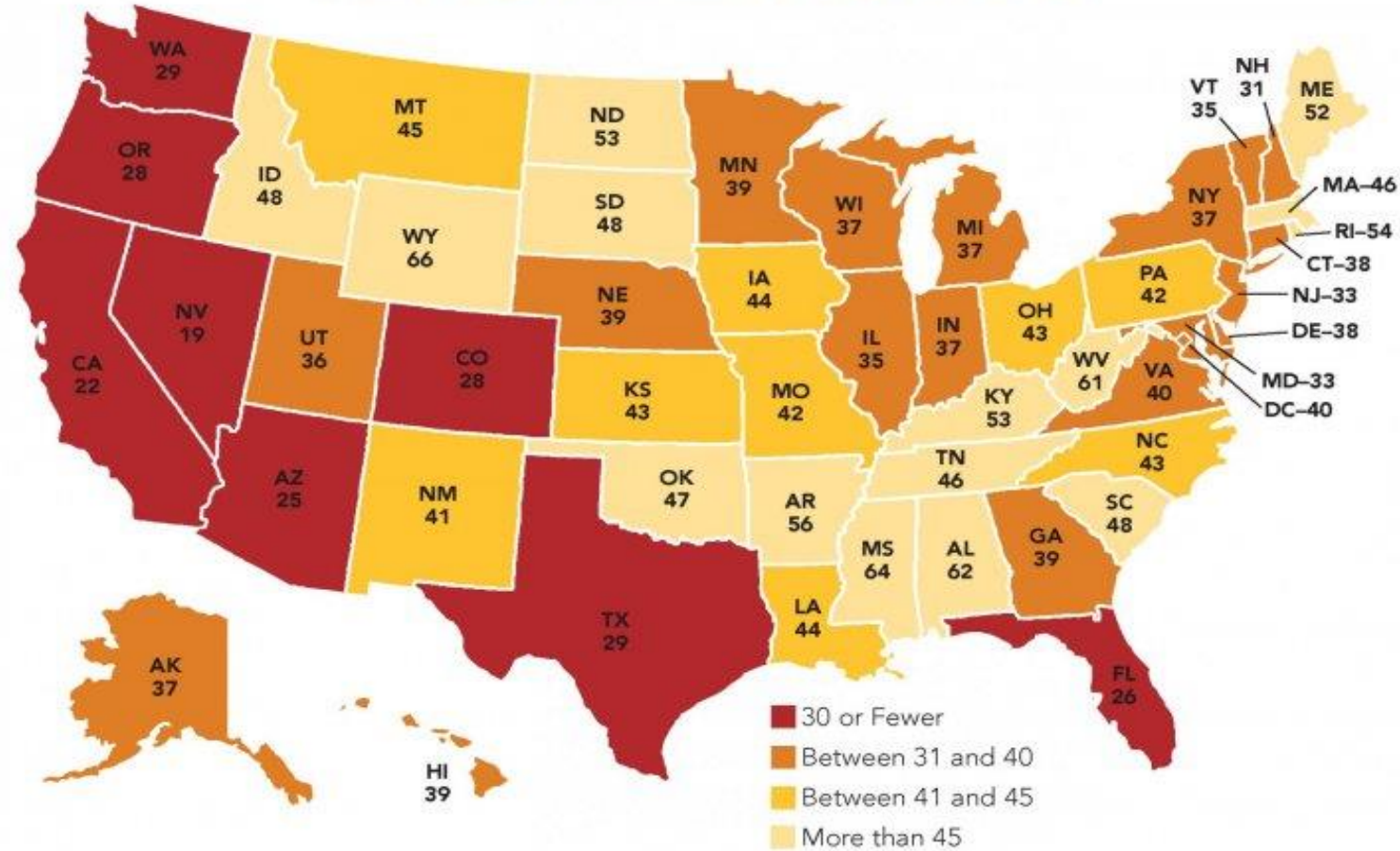

Community Impacts

- Decreased police and emergency service calls
- Keeping vehicles off public streets and spaces
- Preventing more from entering an overburdened shelter system
- Decreased environmental impacts
- Increased probability of stable housing for program participants
- Creating a healthier community
