B.2.1 LDC22-00040 (Daybreak PUD Area 16A) - A request has been made for a tentative map to develop 54 single-family attached dwelling units. The ±10.0 acre subject site is located ±1,500 feet northeast of the intersection of Echo Valley Parkway and South Meadows Parkway. The site is zoned Planned Unit Development Daybreak (PUD). The site has a Master Plan land use designation of Suburban Mixed-Use (SMU) and Parks, Greenways and Open Space (PGOS).

B.2.2 LDC22-00041 (Daybreak PUD Area 16B) - A request has been made for a tentative map to develop 82 single-family attached dwelling units. The ± 15.3 acre subject site is located $\pm 1,500$ feet northeast of the intersection of Echo Valley Parkway and South Meadows Parkway. The site is zoned Planned Unit Development Daybreak (PUD). The site has a Master Plan land use designation of Suburban Mixed-Use (SMU).

B.2.3 LDC22-00047 (975 Terminal Way) - A request has been made for a conditional use permit to establish a "Heavy Machinery and Equipment, Rental, Sales, and Service" use in the Mixed Employment (ME) zoning district to accommodate a new forklift sales, rental, and service facility on a previously developed site containing two existing buildings. The ±1.64 acre site is located on the west side of Terminal Way, ±395 feet south of its intersection with Mill Street. The site has a Master Plan land use designation of MixedEmployment (ME).

B.2.4 ABN21-00006 (Market Street Abandonment) - Request for the abandonment of a ±20,072 square foot portion of public road, Market Street, located between Kietzke Lane and Redwood Place. The site is adjacent to Mixed-Use Urban (MU) and General Commercial (GC) zoning districts, and Urban Mixed-Use (UMU) and Suburban Mixed Use (SMU) Master Plan land use designations respectively.

LDC22-00047 (975 Terminal Way) - A request has been made for a conditional use permit to establish a "Heavy Machinery and Equipment, Rental, Sales, and Service" use in the Mixed Employment (ME) zoning district to accommodate a new forklift sales, rental, and service facility on a previously developed site containing two existing buildings. - As part of their consent agenda, the RPC voted unanimously to find the Washoe County Master Plan amendment for the SOI Rollback-Mae Anne parcels in conformance with the Regional Plan. The amendment establishes a Suburban Residential land use designation on 28 parcels recently removed from the City of Reno's Sphere of Influence and returned to the County's jurisdiction. The parcels are located directly north of I-80 both east and west of Mae Anne Avenue. (Regional Planning case number CR22-001)
- The RPC also received an update on progress to the Natural Resources Plan, including data synthesis and next steps.
