
What is Zoning?

How Does Development Work?


Is the use allowed?

Types of Development Applications

- Title 18 Annexation and Land Development Code (i.e. Zoning Code)
 - Allowed uses
 - Parking requirements
 - Landscaping requirements
 - Sidewalk/parkway requirements
 - Minimum/maximum density
 - Setbacks
 - Height limitations
