Re: Letter of Interest for Council Member- Ward 3

I am pleased to present my application in consideration for the Reno City Council Ward 3 Appointment. I have served on a number of appointed advisory committees, including the Reno Bicycle Council (8 years), Regional Transportation Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Committee (8 years), Truckee River Corridor Committee (2 years), RTC 2030 and 2040 Steering Committees, and Washoe County Open Space and Regional Parks Commission (10 years). I was the first person the NDOT Nevada Bicycle Advisory Board selected to receive the Activist-Supporter Award.

My thirty-nine years of practicing law will help in reaching solutions and moderate differences. I want to be part of the Reno City Council team that builds consensus for important projects to help Reno create jobs, deal with the homeless and improve our quality of life. Reno has done an amazing job in recent years fighting the opioid crisis, reducing violent gun crimes and adding body cameras to policemen. I am very pleased to see the progressive steps Reno has taken to help homeless people deal with shelter and deal with their mental health and drug addiction issues. Reno's credit rating has improved to an A+ Bond rating allowing the refinance of bonds that resulted in huge tax payer savings. Reno has been nationally recognized as one of the best cities for getting outdoors and one of the best small cities for small businesses and technology. It would be a tremendous honor to be party of the City's vision moving forward. Below is an outline of some of my thoughts on recurring issues:

#### LAND USE:

Leap-frog development does not make sense for providing schools, police and fire services. These remote developments should contribute more for essential services. Admittedly, over time the additional tax revenues will go into a pool for the whole city. This is a complex balancing act. Reno needs to be able to find ways for people to be able to afford to live here, and property is generally cheaper in remote areas to build moderate priced housing. Without expanding our footprint to provide affordable housing, people get stuck paying \$1,200 a month rent for a motel room that doesn't even have a kitchen.

We need to provide for innovative and responsible growth without repeating the history of arguments over complex annexation credits and disputes over the costs of the closest fire department responding to a crisis. For years there was friction on whether the county, which uses 3-man fire crews, should have to pay for the actual costs of a 4-man fire crew from Reno when they respond to a call for mutual aid. The breakdown of automatic aid on fire calls and the lawsuits for unreimbursed costs has caused strife between Reno and Washoe County on unrelated issues. As a 2012 candidate for Reno City Council, I was invited to participate in a Reno Fire Department's training course, which made me appreciate how a four man crew would be safer to handle a burning building or accident on a busy road. I suspect this problem of allocating the costs for first responders may repeat itself as Reno continues to leap over islands that remain in the county to annex new areas to develop. The Reno Fire Department averages about five calls per hour, 365 days a year, and they often send fire engines and men to help combat wildfires in Northern California. I will keep in mind the complexities of providing essential services to those proposed new developments.

#### TRANSPORTATION:

I generally support multi-use transit oriented corridors. It makes streets much easier for traffic to frequent merchants and safer as motorists slow down just a little. I would like to encourage affordable, alternate transportation. I was happy to read that the Bird Scooter rental program has not resulted in many accidents, but I've heard from people that tried them, the rental fee is higher than taking a cab. Regardless of whether I would support renewing their contract in a couple of years, electric scooters will become more popular. Rules need to be enforced to prevent parked scooters from blocking wheelchairs from passing on the sidewalks.

#### **BUDGET:**

Who knows when we might face another pandemic, like the COVID crisis that stifled tourism, slashed city revenues and closed many businesses? I would fight to increase our emergency reserve, because balancing the budget by cutting police and fire would be the last resort. The State of Nevada limits Reno's revenue sources, but there may be some regional revenues to explore.

A potential way of saving money for regional services would be not having to duplicate services in each jurisdiction. We must maintain a good working relationship with Sparks and Washoe County. We have done well working together towards a regional plan for road development. We need to work together on issues, such as a flood management plan, homeless services, senior services, expanding the sewer treatment plant and cooperative marketing for travel & tourism.

#### FLOOD MANAGEMENT:

Although n 2018, voters opposed WC-1 to increase property taxes to fund the proposed flood management plan, I would really like to be a part of moving forward


with the Truckee River Flood Management Authority on reducing this risk. If we can't afford beautiful tall walls, with imprinted murals that were part of the plan voters rejected to retain flood water, let's stack boulders in those critical areas to contain floods. I also believe there are several fairly wide areas of the Truckee River that the City could manage the surface water to create safe swimming areas, like at Wingfield Park.

We live in a great place with many unique and special attributes to help draw new businesses and tourists. I could put my whole heart into helping our city reduce blight, provide for the homeless and clean up certain areas with innovative ideas. I've adopted three roadways picking up roadside trash with Keep Truckee Meadows beautiful for over ten years. I would love to be part of making our neighborhoods safe to walk, promote more trees, support a robust park system and provide greater access to open space and recreational programs for all ages.

Much can be accomplished with coordinated volunteers who love our community. I would consider it a great honor and privilege to serve as a Reno City Council member. Thank you for your consideration.
