



# Structure

Are they a herd?

Are they a band?





A **BAND** is what we consider a family unit.

Several bands together in an area make up a **HERD**.





# **Family Band**

A Band Stallion is the protector, warding off challenges by other stallions and threats. He also has breeding rights to the mares in the band.







### **Lead Mare**

The lead mare often makes the decisions when it's time for the band to go to water, or to rest, or to move on. She can often be seen on alert and warning the rest of the band of perceived danger.



# Bands can consist of just two horses or many more...

### **Mares**

After the lead mare there can be other mares in the band. They often form close relationships and stick tightly together.

### **Colts and Fillies**

Colts are male offspring who generally get pushed out of the band at 2-3 years old. They spend several years with other "bachelor" stallions until they are mature enough to form their own band. Fillies are often allowed to be stolen by other stallions, moving on to join a new family band.

### **Lieutenant Stallion**

Some bands have a lieutenant who takes care of the protection of the band and sometimes has breeding rights.





The lead mare is out front, young horse in the middle of other mares and the band stallion bringing up the rear - a common sight on the Virginia Range!

# Flehmen Response

Are they making funny faces? Horses and other animals have an auxilliary scent organ above the roof of the mouth. By curling the upper lip above the teeth and gums they enhance the scent through a duct behind the front teeth and can explore a scent of interest!



# **Sparring**

While stallions can certainly be seen fighting for protection of a band, you may also see what looks like fighting but is actually bachelor stallions "sparring" or "practicing" their skills. While it can seem intense, they will often just stop and walk away together to graze.



# Physical Connection

Horses can often be seen in physical contact with each other, especially at rest. This can be to help ward off flies in summer, share body heat in winter, but they also do it to express their deep connection to each other.



### Virginia Range Land Ownership




### **Private Ownership**











# Illegal Feeding & Diversionary Feeding

### **Completed & In-Progress**

- Diversionary feeding purpose
- Approved diversionary feeding is starting for the season
- New 2022 sites will be an approved half mile distance from roads/buildings/structures or approved on a case-by-case basis
- Signage related to illegal feeding by WHC and City of Reno

Virginia Range Wild Horses

- -They can only digest range forage.
- -Your "harmless" snack can KILL.

-Apples, carrots, fruit, or ANY food can cause choking and/or colic often resulting in painful death.

-Stay 100 feet from wild horses.

### Wild Horse Laws:

Illegal to Feed or Harass Wild Horses.

NRS 569.040, NRS 504.490 UPTO \$2,000 FINE

# Preliminary analysis of the Jan-June time period comparing 2020 to 2022 shows:



61.4%
Reduction in births

Mortality Rate (mostly predation) of foals born traditionally holds around 50% by 15 months of age

Population rate along the City of Reno interface, from Hidden Valley to Geiger Grade has started to DECREASE with more deaths than births.





(Posted Speed Limit: 45 MPH)

	South Bound	North Bound
North	48	51
South	47	44

# Actions Taken To Improve Safety

### **Completed & In-Progress**

- South Veteran's Parkway Speed Study
- Installation of speed radar feedback signs (4 total)
- Rio Wrangler Parkway & Steamboat Parkway lowered speed limits
- Social media campaigns and public outreach campaigns on dangers of speeding

### **Under Consideration**

 Research into creating an advisory speed limit at night vs regulatory speed during day on Veterans Parkway.

# **APPENDIX**

# Veterans Parkway Speed Study

- Staff performed a Federal Highway
   Administration USLIMITS2 speed study on
   Veterans Parkway.
- Roadway geometrics, land use, pedestrian & bicycle activity, free flow vehicle speeds, crashes, amongst other factors are considered.
- The 85<sup>th</sup>-Pecentile Speed was measured at 50 MPH. The 50<sup>th</sup>-Percentile Speed was measured at 43 MPH.
- 45 MPH (50<sup>th</sup>-Percentile) posted speed limit was selected due to pedestrian and bicycle activity.
