Docket No. 23-03006

Date Opened: 03/01/2023

Description: Application of SPPC for approval of fuel and purchased power expenses, to reset the Temporary Renewable Energy Development charge, reset all components of the Renewable Energy Program Rate, reset the Base Energy Efficiency Program Rates, reset the Base Energy Efficiency Implementation Rates, reset the Energy Efficiency Program Amortization Rate, reset the Energy Efficiency Implementation Amortization Rate, and reset the Expanded Solar Program Costs Rate.

Status: 03-01-23 Application filed.

Impact: This is the Annual Deferred Accounting Adjustment Application of SPPC for 2022.

Description: Report of NPC and SPPC on the progress of its Action Plan relative to its 2022-2041 Integrated

Resource Plan.

Status: 3-1-2023 Joint Application filed.

Status Notice of Application 1/25/23 filed.

Impact: Inclusion in the IRP amendment was to address resource adequacy especially during summer months, as the quickest method to bring resources online. Renewable energy development is long term.
