Please find the attached 2023 Q2 (April 1 through June 30) Report for Waste Management.

Report Highlights:

- Franchise fees paid to the City: \$1,465,121.83 (+\$58, 731.05 from Q1)
- Host fees paid to the City: \$74,430 (+\$17,393.52 from Q1)
- Neighborhood cleanup boxes used: 27 of 35 used
- Transfer Station allowance used: \$266,160.24 of \$1,115,614.00 (24% of allowance)
- Collection allowance used: \$536,041.16 of \$1,149,459.00 (47% of allowance)
- Lockwood allowance used: \$927.92 of \$54,420.00 (1.7% of allowance)
- Total waste diverted: 4970.87 tons (+200.23 tons from previous quarter)

- Council used 27 of 35 dumpsters for neighborhood cleanups in this quarter.
- Reno Direct received 5 calls this quarter related to Waste Management. Four of those calls were complaints. Inquires ranged from complaints regarding poor communication from WM, missed services, overflowing dumpsters, and dissatisfaction with pick-up times, to general questions about services.
