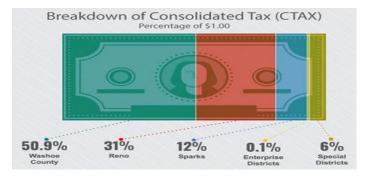
**SUBJECT:** Follow Up from Budget Workshop

This memo has been prepared to provide the Council with supplemental information to the budget workshop presented on March 18, 2024. This memo addresses topics that were brought up during the workshop for further information. If you have questions after reviewing this information, please notify the Scheduling Team to coordinate an individual briefing.

# Breakdown of property tax and consolidated tax by jurisdiction

For property tax, the City receives approximately 26 cents of each dollar. For consolidated tax, the city receives approximately 31 cents of each dollar. Below is a breakdown by agency:





## **Operating expenses for new facilities**

The FY25 annual operating expenses for the Monana Aquatic & Fitness Cener and the Public Safety Center are \$1,829,483 and \$342,816 respectively. This includes the addition of seven new positions. Exhibit A shows a detailed list for each facility.

# Affordable housing sewer and building fee subsidy program update

Reno Municipal code (RMC) Chapter 1.08 provides a process for affordable housing projects to request a reduction or subsidization of building permit fees and sewer connection fees, if certain affordability criteria are met and subject to Council approval.

On November 1, 2023, Council capped the total amount of sewer connection fee subsidies at \$11,318,399 through June 30, 2025. The total amount approved by the Council to date is \$9,402,153 leaving \$1,916,246 for future projects over the next 15 months. Detailed sewer connection fee information is shown in Exhibit B.

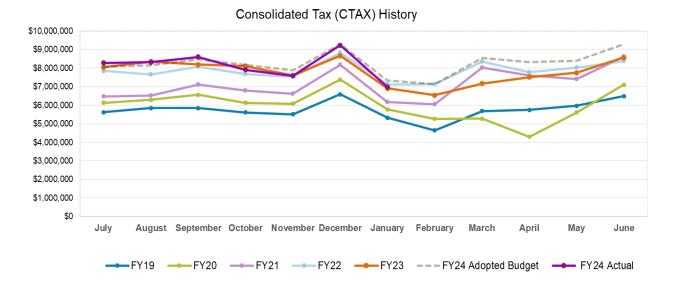
Over the past three years, \$714,417 has been waived in building permit fees, encompassing 1,276 affordable housing units. A breakdown of the building permit fee amounts by project is shown in Exhibit C.

# Revenue update on property tax and consolidated tax

The Department of Taxation released the final property tax information on March 25. This resulted in an increase of \$995,081 in revenue for the General Fund that was not anticipated with the budget as presented on March 18.

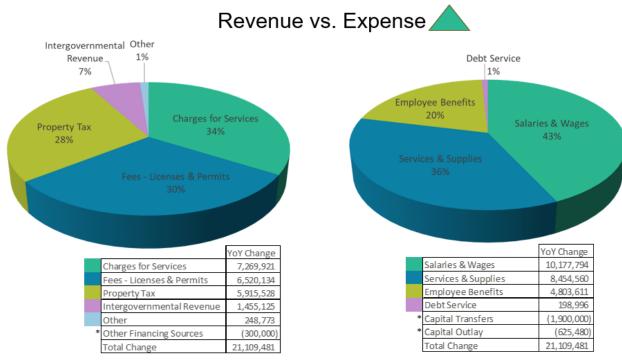

Consolidated taxes for January came in 4.7% below budget. Nationwide consumer spending in January was down. February data will be important before finalizing the budget for FY25. At this time, the extra revenue in property tax is estimated to cover any changes in the FY25 budget in consolidated tax.



# **Comparison of General Fund Revenue and Expenditure Change**

The Council requested a comparison of General Fund revenue growth versus expenditure. This information is generally provided to the Council at the second workshop when the estimates are more refined. At the March 18 workshop the change (delta) comparison of revenue versus expenditure growth is shown below:

# Comparison of the fee schedule with other regional agencies

Included as Exhibit D is a comparison of the City of Reno FY24 Adopted and FY25 Proposed Fee Schedule with other regional agencies. Every effort was made to compare the City of Reno's Fee Schedule against the City of Sparks, Washoe County, Carson City, and other closely related agencies as applicable. Due to the unique composition of all agency schedules, some line items do not have a direct comparison available. Those instances have been noted with "N/A". Where possible, comparable fees from these agencies have been provided line by line for your review. The Municipal Court Fee Schedule is not included in this comparison as the entire schedule is established by NRS. All fees set by NRS are subject to change by the state legislature.

## **Other Post Employment Benefits (OPEB)**

Additional information on OPEB was requested for review. Exhibit E is the presentation that was given by the actuarial MacLeod Watts to the Financial Advisory Board and the OPEB Advisory Board earlier this year. It includes detailed information on plan valuation and history.

## **Redevelopment Agency (RDA) Projects**

Historical information on RDA projects and how those were funded was requested by the Council. SUBJECT: Affordable Housing Sewer Connection Fee Subsidy Program Update *Updated* 

This memorandum is provided as an update to City Council and no action is being requested at this time.

At the March 18, 2024 City Council Budget Workshop, Councilmember Taylor requested information on the affordable housing sewer connection subsidy program as it related to tracking the amount of subsidies and the fiscal sustainability of the program.

On November 1, 2023, Council took the following action:

- 1. Approved an additional \$4,000,000 for sewer connection fee reductions out of the sewer fund through the end of FY25;
- 2. Directed staff to evaluate sustainability of current program and impact to sewer user fees to maintain an annual subsidy for this program as part of the sewer fund sufficiency review performed every two years (due January 2025); and
- 3. Determine alternate funding sources for consideration during FY26 budget discussions.

As a result of this action, the total amount of sewer connection fee subsidies was capped at \$11,318,399 through June 30, 2025. Per the table below, the total amount approved by Council to date is \$9,402,153 leaving \$1,916,246 for future projects over the next 15 months.

Staff prepares a sewer fund sufficiency analysis every two years and will include an option for ongoing funding of the affordable housing sewer connection fee subsidy program and report back the impact to current fees. In addition, staff will continue to look for alternative funding sources through federal and state grant opportunities.

This memo has been prepared to provide an update on the affordable housing building permit fee subsidy program.

Reno Municipal Code (RMC) Chapter 1.08 provides a process for affordable housing projects to request a reduction or subsidization of building permit fees and sewer connection fees, if they meet certain affordability criteria, and subject to Council approval. Over the past three years, \$714,417 has been waived in building permit fees, encompassing 1,276 affordable housing units. Below is a breakdown of the building permit fee amounts by project.

## PRIMARY PURPOSE OF THIS REPORT

Valuation reports can be for many purposes, most commonly for

- Accounting (audit)
- Plan funding

These reports are to support plan accounting for the City's fiscal year ended June 30, 2023.

- PEBP retirees (closed plan covering 135 retirees)
- City Health Benefit Plan (1,246 actives, 738 retirees)

They are based on adjusted results (roll forward) of the January 1, 2022 actuarial valuations.

### BASICS OF THE ACTUARIAL VALUATION

### Whether pension or OPEB, the basic approach is the same:

- We ask questions about who gets how much for how long
- We make a lot of assumptions about the future
- We put a price tag on it all in today's dollars
   Present Value of Future Benefits PVFB
- We allocate the total expected benefit cost (the PVFB) for each person to the years we expect the person to work.

Past service (Total OPEB Liability for GASB purposes)
Current service – Service Cost
Future Service – Future Service Costs

## HERE ARE SOME QUESTIONS & ASSUMPTIONS

We are prepared to explain and discuss any of the assumptions used in the valuation.

- How long will retirees receive benefits? (Mortality, life expectancy)
- Do dependents get any benefits? While the retiree is alive? As survivors?
- Will benefits increase in the future? (Healthcare trend, bargained increases)
- What is the probability this current employee will stick around and retire from this agency? (Termination/withdrawal rates)
- If he/she does retire, at what age retire?
   (Retirement rates)
- Will the new retiree take the coverage or waive it? (Participation rates)
- Will the retiree cover dependents? Which plan will they choose? Will they keep coverage until death or drop it? And so on ....

### For the City Plan

- Much larger, ongoing plan
- The City set up an OPEB trust about 7 years ago to begin prefunding this plan.
- We determine the discount rate by a long-term projection which weights the muni bond rate with the trust return rate.
- At FYE 2022, the discount rate was 6% and the ratio of assets to the TOL was 12.6%.
- At FYE 2023, the discount rate was 6.5% and the ratio of assets to the TOL was 17.9%.
- If there were no trust, the TOL calculated at the bond rate would increase from \$145 million to about \$203 million.

## BENEFITS OF PREFUNDING

- Higher discount rate, lower liability
- Can offset the (now lower) liability by the trust asset value
- Improved benefit security
- Cost of borrowing improved
- Taxpayer equity

### OPEB AMOUNTS TO BE RECOGNIZED

The Net OPEB Liability (NOL) is not the only information to be reported in the notes to the financial statements.

The entire <u>change</u> in the NOL is not recognized immediately each year. Differences between current actual results versus expected results are recognized gradually in the Statement of net Position.

The portions not currently recognized are carried as:

deferred inflows (reductions in the NOL not yet recognized) or deferred outflows (increases in the NOL not yet recognized).

### CHANGES REQUIRING DEFERRED RECOGNITION

There are 4 types of changes the actuary must identify and track:

Benefit changes

Reduced City Plan Liability by \$1.1 million for Retirees Shared with Truckee Meadows FPD

Changes in assumptions or methods

Reduced City Plan Liability by \$8.1 million from improving the discount rate from 6.0% to 6.5%.

Plan experience

Differences between projected liabilities and actual from new census or other data higher or lower than expected; not reviewed in this period

Investment experience

Actual trust earnings during the period were \$1.3 million better than assumed, which reduced the Net OPEB Liability.

### DEFERRED RECOGNITION PERIODS

The change in TOL or change in assets (FNP) are recognized in gradually, with the 1<sup>st</sup> installment recognized in the current period.

Benefit changes

The full change in the TOL is reflected during the current period

Investment experience

The excess or shortfall in actual earnings over expected is recognized over 5 years

Changes in assumptions or methods

These changes are reflected over a weighted Expected Average Remaining Service Life ("EARSL"). This is recalculated for new changes every time new census data is used in the valuation. This is 8.14 for the City Plan.

Plan experience

Same EARSL period as for assumption changes
