SUBJECT: City Walks Summary April 29 – May 2, 2024

City Walks were created as an interdepartmental approach to assess concerns in real-time, identify solutions, and improve the quality of life for residents. The walks also assist in expediting services to vulnerable populations. City Walks occur weekly, Monday through Thursday.

- Monday and Wednesday walks are coordinated based upon service requests received by the Clean and Safe program. These walks may occur anywhere within the City of Reno.
- Tuesday and Thursday walks are dedicated to areas within the Business Improvement District (BID). Locations are coordinated by the Downtown Reno Partnership.

The following data is an overview of weekly City Walk outcomes for April 29 – May 2.

Monday, April 29

 - o 5 individuals were contacted and denied services
 - o 3 nuisance vehicles were issued 24-hour notice postings

- Locations: 4th Street, Fireside alley, Evans Avenue, and 6th Street
- Departments in attendance:

Wednesday, May 1

- Locations: Brinkby Avenue, Lymbery Street, Isbell Road, South Virginia Street, and Gentry Way
- Departments in attendance:

 - o Code Enforcement
 - o Reno Police Department
- Outcomes:
 - o 2 individuals were contacted and denied services
 - o 2 code enforcement cases were opened due to property maintenance and nuisance concerns
 - Abandoned structure on private property
 - Broken fence on private property
 - o 9 unregistered vehicles were issued 48-hour notice postings
 - o 1 nuisance vehicle was issued a 24-hour notice posting
 - o 3 nuisance vehicles departed the area upon staff arrival
 - o 1 service request submitted to repaint sidewalk curb due to fading
 - o 4 shopping carts recovered
 - o 3 Reno Direct service requests were addressed

Thursday, May 2, with the Downtown Reno Partnership
