Order of Business

The presiding officer shall determine the order of the agenda and all questions of parliamentary procedure at the meeting. Items on the agenda may be taken out of order. The public body may combine two or more agenda items for consideration, remove items from the agenda, and/or delay discussion on or continue scheduled agenda items at any time. Items scheduled to be heard at a specific time will be heard no earlier than the stated time but may be heard later.

Public Comment

Public comment is limited to three (3) minutes per person. Unused time may not be reserved by the speaker, nor allocated to another speaker. No action may be taken on a matter raised under general public comment until the matter is included on a subsequent agenda as an action item. Comments received prior to 4:00 p.m. on the day preceding the meeting will be transcribed, provided to the public body for review, and entered into the record. Comments received after 4:00 p.m. on the day preceding the meeting will be provided to the public body for review prior to adjournment and entered into the record.

On specific agenda items, the presiding officer may prohibit comment if the content of comments is a topic that is not relevant to, or within the authority of, the public body, or if the content is willfully disruptive of the meeting by being irrelevant, repetitious, slanderous, offensive, inflammatory, irrational or amounting to personal attacks or interfering with the rights of the other speakers. Any person making willfully disruptive remarks while addressing the public body or while attending the meeting may be removed from the room by the presiding officer, see NRS 241, and the person may be barred from further audience before the public body during that session. See, Nevada Attorney General Opinion No. 00-47 (April 27, 2001); Nevada Open Meeting Law Manual, §8.05.

Other examples of disruptive conduct include, without limitation, yelling, stamping of feet, whistles, applause, heckling, name-calling, use of profanity, personal attacks, physical intimidation, threatening use of physical force, assault, battery, or any other acts intended to impede the meeting or infringe on the rights of the public body or meeting participants.

A. Introductory Items

A1. Call to Order/Roll Call

Chair Erik Fong called the meeting to order at 11:02 AM in person and via Zoom. Committee members present were Erik Fong, Kelli DuFresne, Chelsea Houston, Kylie Howard, Brenna O'Boyle, and Megan O'Reilly. A quorum was established. Constance Hightower arrived at 11:06 AM. Commissioner Sara Paschall was not present.

Also present were Staff Liaison Megan Berner, Anza Jarschke, and Erica Hill.

Berner read the Public Notice statement regarding ways for the public to participate in today's meeting.

A2. Public Comment.

There were no comments.

- A3. Approval of the Agenda (For Possible Action) May 13, 2024 It was moved by O'Reilly and seconded by Houston to approve the agenda as presented. Motion carried unanimously.
- A4. Approval of the Minutes (For Possible Action) February 12 and April 22, 2024 It was moved by Howard and seconded by Houston to approve the February and April meeting minutes as presented. Motion carried unanimously.
 - **A5.** Council Liaison Report

No report was given.

A6. Staff Liaison Report

Berner reported the first 3 calls for artists for the Safety Center have been released and will be open until the end of the month.

New Program Assistant Erica Hill was introduced. However, Anza Jarschke will be leaving.

Berner announced the artwork for East 4th Street is being installed beginning May 20. A celebration of the project and dedication will be scheduled for early June. It has taken almost five years to get this project done.

The Oddie Boulevard and Moana Springs projects continue to move forward. The Work Program for next year will be considered as the City's budget is finalized in June.

Jarschke described the public art clean up and repairs in progress, thanks to an increased budget.

B. Business Items

B1. Presentation and request for funding from Eddie Guth, Nevada Museum of Art E.L. Cord Museum School Director, and Alexsis Adams, Communities in Schools of Western Nevada Program Director regarding a collaborative summer program to paint a mural at Mira Loma Park. (For Possible Action)

Guth and Adams described the programs each organization does in general and this collaborative program in particular. This is the third year of a student program, designed to involve high school students in public art. They discussed details of the program, including benefits to both the students and the community. Ray Valdez was introduced as the artist selected for the Mira Loma Park project.

Berner showed photos of three locations in the park for public art. Valdez described the process working with the students on the concepts for the art.

Guth reviewed the request of \$7500 for the project, which includes a stipend to the student artists for their work. The proposed art design will come to the PAC in June.

It was moved by O'Boyle and seconded by O'Reilly to request the Arts Commission approve \$7,500 for this project. Motion carried unanimously.

The Committee members reviewed the scoring to select thirteen artists for this year's Art Signals program. There was a brief discussion about criteria to give preference to local artists and those who have not participated before, which may be added to next year's application.

It was moved by Howard and seconded by Houston to recommend the following artists for the Arts Signal program not to exceed \$13,000: Alexandria Arciniega, John Becker, Brooke Brazil, Jorge Ceja, Eva Chaplin, Alyssa Cumpton, Meghan Dragon, Julia Flippo, Jenny Krupka, Charly Malpass, Joseph Morales, Orlando Ortiz, and Colton Ralphs. Motion carried unanimously.

B3. Review, discussion, and possible recommendation of an artist for the Evelyn Mount Northeast Community Center Mural Project in an amount not to exceed \$35,000 from the list of the following artists in alphabetical order: Rafael Blanco, Brooke Brazil, Erik Burke, Isaac Caruso, Bryce Chisholm, Naomi DeVore, Connor Fogal, Frank Gardner, Asa Kennedy, MJ Lindo, Charly Malpass, Andres Martinez, Edwin Martinez-Esco, Hayley Meadows, Jesse Melanson, Christina Morrisson, Orlando Ortiz, Potentialist Workshop, Swati Rastogi, Arthur Richmond, Cyan Samone, Rebecca Wallace. Scores of the proposals for the Evelyn Mount mural project were reviewed, including the letters of interest that described the artist's plan for community engagement.

It was moved by O'Reilly and seconded by Howard to recommend Erik Burke for the Evelyn Mount Northeast Community Center Mural Project in an amount not to exceed \$35,000. Motion carried unanimously.

B4. Review, discussion, and possible recommendation of an artist for the North Valleys Sky Vista Roundabout Public Art Project in an amount not to exceed \$120,000 from the list of the following artists in alphabetical order: James Dinh, Tylur French, Virginia Kistler. (For Possible Action)

Berner presented results of the Community Survey conducted for this project. The community ranked the three artists very closely, but James Dinh was preferred. Discussion followed as the Committee reviewed the proposals.

It was moved by Houston and seconded by O'Reilly to recommend James Dinh for the North Valleys Sky Vista Roundabout Public Art Project in an amount not to exceed \$120,000. Motion carried unanimously.

B5. Discussion on decommissioning of Locomotion mural on ReTRAC Plaza East. (For Possible Action)

Berner reported ARPA funding was allocated by the City Council for this project. The Locomotion mural has been repainted a few times, but it is degrading. The City's recommendation is to decommission the mural. Berner said shipping containers are being put on the plaza for a variety of uses and suggested those could be painted. The Locomotion mural was painted by community members and that effort could be revitalized.

Discussion followed. There was support for Berner's idea of bringing the community back in to participate in painting the containers. Berner will confirm ARPA funds can be used in this way. At any rate, the community should be involved.

SIGNAL BOX PAINTINGS ELIGIBILITY:

The Project is open to artists in a regional area encompassing Nevada and Northern California with experience in public art projects. Preference will be given to local artists.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The Reno Arts & Culture Commission (RACC) is seeking an artist/artist team to design and paint artwork on the signal boxes in City Plaza.

Goals of this project include: transforming utilitarian structure into an art form; increasing public awareness of art; broadening viewers' perspectives of public spaces within the city; and fostering a sense of place on City Plaza. The artist(s) selected should have demonstrated experience working in public locations subject to vandalism. Artwork will be selected based on the quality of design and have a 5-year life expectancy.

Proposals should consider aesthetically pleasing use of color and form as well as relate well to the surrounding environs in which they will be placed. Proposals should reflect thoughtful consideration of locations and site-specificity. Large areas of black and/or dark colors are not allowed due to the risk of overheating the electrical boxes. Outside murals are subject to the harshest environmental conditions; murals must be painted with high-quality color-fast paint with the proven ability to maintain colorfastness for five-years. Materials, colors used, and design will be at the approval of the City of Reno. Upon application the artist must take into consideration: need for doors or hinges to open, keyholes not to be painted over, and not covering vents. The appropriateness and quality of proposals is determined by the-- Public Art Committee whose recommendations are provided to the Reno Arts and Culture Commission for final approval.

SPECIFICATIONS:

Selected artist(s) will design and execute one-of-a-kind two-dimensional images that wrap around all sides and the top of the multiple signal boxes. Paint specifications as follows: Main coat (Chroma Acrylic Mural Paint, Golden Heavy Body Artist Acrylics, Liquitex Heavy Body

Acrylics, Rust-Oleum Professional Rust Resistant Enamel Spray Paint). Arts and Culture Staff will prep the box for painting and apply a graffiti coating upon completion.

CALL FOR ARTISTS

Public Safety Center Keunzli Sculpture Public Art Project Reno, Nevada

Deadline: May 31, 2024, at 11:00 pm PST Budget: \$200,000

SUMMARY:

Construction is currently underway for the new City of Reno Public Safety Center, which will soon serve as the headquarters for the Reno Police Department (RPD). The City of Reno is accepting qualifications from artists/artist teams for an exterior public art installation outside the building's public entrance. Part of this project includes a community engagement component. Selected artist(s) will be expected to work with City staff to conduct community engagement sessions with users of the building and the surrounding neighborhood. The final design of the artwork will be created from input from these sessions.

There are a total of five artist calls for distinct art needs and locations at the new Public Safety Center. You are invited to apply for as many as you are interested in and qualified for.

ARTIST QUALIFICATIONS / ELIGIBILITY:

This is a national call and request for qualifications. This project is open to any artist regardless of race, color, creed, gender, gender variance, national origin, age, religion, marital status, political opinion or affiliation, or mental or physical handicap. Artists may apply as a single artist or as a multi-person collaborative group. In the case of a group, please apply under one single application. Artists and teams working in the United States and who have experience implementing projects with a similar budget and scope are encouraged to apply.

- Artists age 18 or older may apply as an individual or a team
- Must be available for on-site visit to Reno
- Eligible applicants must reside in the United States

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The City of Reno is seeking artists for an exterior public art sculpture to be placed along Keunzli Street at the new Public Safety Center. The City is looking for projects that take into consideration the history of the site and the unique characteristics of the surrounding environment.

The selection committee is looking for a large-scale art project that is appropriate for placement at the employee parking lot entrance of the public safety facility and for the diverse Reno community. The location is highly visible from Keunzli Street, near the intersection with Manuel Street. The incorporation of lighted elements within the artwork is required, running conduit will be the part of the artist's responsibility. The theme of the artwork does not need to

be directly connected to public safety functions and imagery, or to Reno history.

The installation will be placed in a landscaped area within the security fence. Artwork should take into account the slated metal security fence, to maintain visibility from outside of the parking lot. The location is near the employee entrance directly off of Keunzli Street and will be highly visible to passersby. See below for site images.

The goals for the project include: creating a unique character for a specific area of town, increasing public awareness of art, engaging with the community to create something that reflects the area, and broadening visitors' perspectives of public spaces within the City. The artist(s) selected should have demonstrated experience working in public locations subject to vandalism and extreme weather.

The RACC seeks artists with prior public art experience, specifically large-scale sculptural work. The \$200,000 commission will cover all services from design through final installation/implementation, including artist fee, fabrication, insurance, transportation, travel fees, equipment, and installation. Final selection of one artist or team will be made by the PAC, RACC, and stakeholders and approved by Reno City Council based on qualifications and proposal.

Selected artists/artist teams/design team will be expected to work with the community, City staff, and stakeholders to design the final artwork.

ABOUT THE LOCATION:

Located in the heart of our downtown, the building's central location helps ensure RPD's swift emergency response and makes it convenient for residents to access. The site was formerly home to the Reno Gazette-Journal. Renovating the existing building provides a more sustainable option, allowing the City to reduce waste while also preserving a rich piece of the Biggest Little City's history.

From no dedicated public parking at the previous RPD station to approximately 50 public spaces, the Public Safety Center is designed to ease public access. Once inside, community members will be greeted by a large lobby, a public meeting space, and improved victim reporting areas.

Other notable features include:

- Four interview areas, including a family room
- Enhanced technology throughout the building
- 28,000 square feet of evidence storage
- Improved security and safety features
- Wellness amenities for staff to recreate and recharge such as a gym, sleeping rooms, and an inviting outdoor space
- Female-focused additions for employees like more women's locker rooms and a private lactation room

Sustainable design elements including rooftop solar

BUDGET:

Projected budget is not to exceed \$200,000 for the entire project. This budget is inclusive of all costs associated with the design, planning, fabrication, installation, and completion of the project. This budget includes all travel costs and insurance.

SELECTION PROCESS & CRITERIA:

- ## The review committee will select three finalists to interview.
- The finalists will be invited to give a virtual presentation to the Public Art Committee to share more about their artistic process, past work, and plans, inspiration, and possible concept for this commission. Each finalist will receive an honorarium of \$1,500 for the presentation and initial concept.

SUMMARY:

Construction is currently underway for the new City of Reno Public Safety Center, which will soon serve as the headquarters for the Reno Police Department (RPD). The City of Reno is accepting qualifications from artists/artist teams for an exterior public art installation outside the building's public entrance. This project will add vibrancy to the building and surrounding area. Part of this project includes a community engagement component. Selected artist(s) will be expected to work with City staff to conduct community engagement sessions with users of the building and the surrounding neighborhood. The final design of the artwork will be created from input from these sessions.

There are a total of five artist calls for distinct art needs and locations at the new Public Safety Center. You are invited to apply for as many as you are interested in and qualified for.

ARTIST QUALIFICATIONS / ELIGIBILITY:

This is a national call and request for qualifications. This project is open to any artist regardless of race, color, creed, gender, gender variance, national origin, age, religion, marital status, political opinion or affiliation, or mental or physical handicap. Artists may apply as a single artist or as a multi-person collaborative group. In the case of a group, please apply under one single application. PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The City of Reno is seeking artists for an exterior public art installation outside the new Public Safety Center. The City is looking for projects that take into consideration the history of the site and the unique characteristics of the surrounding environment.

The selection committee is looking for a unique, one-of-a-kind, public art installation that is appropriate for placement outside the main entrance of the public safety facility and for the diverse Reno community. The placement lends itself to sculpture that takes into account Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED). The incorporation of lighted elements within the artwork is desired, but not required. The theme of the artwork does not need to be directly connected to public safety functions and imagery, or to Reno history.

The installation will be placed in the public plaza leading up to the main entrance of the building. See below for site images.

The goals for the project include: creating a unique character for a specific area of town, increasing public awareness of art, engaging with the community to create something that reflects the area, and broadening visitors' perspectives of public spaces within the City. The artist(s) selected should have demonstrated experience working in public locations subject to vandalism and extreme weather.

The RACC seeks artists with prior public art experience, specifically large-scale sculptural work. The \$175,000 commission will cover all services from design through final installation/implementation, including artist fee, fabrication, insurance, transportation, travel fees, equipment, and installation. Final selection of one artist or team will be made by the PAC, RACC, and stakeholders and approved by Reno City Council based on qualifications and proposal.

ABOUT THE LOCATION:

Located in the heart of our downtown, the building's central location helps ensure RPD's swift emergency response and makes it convenient for residents to access. The site was formerly home to the Reno Gazette-Journal. Renovating the existing building provides a more sustainable option, allowing the City to reduce waste while also preserving a rich piece of the Biggest Little City's history.

From no dedicated public parking at the previous RPD station to approximately 50 public spaces, the Public Safety Center is designed to ease public access. Once inside, community members will be greeted by a large lobby, a public meeting space, and improved victim reporting areas.

Other notable features include:

- Four interview areas, including a family room
- Enhanced technology throughout the building
- 28,000 square feet of evidence storage
- Improved security and safety features
- Wellness amenities for staff to recreate and recharge such as a gym, sleeping rooms, and an inviting outdoor space
- Female-focused additions for employees like more women's locker rooms and a private lactation room
- Sustainable design elements including rooftop solar

BUDGET:
