SUBJECT: Virginia Range Wildlife and Safety Management Plan Update

This memorandum is provided as an update to City Council and no action is being requested currently.

Horse Protection Project North Phase (Mira Loma south to Carmella Ranch) - On July 31, 2024, City Council approved the award of construction contract to Soil-Tech, Inc. to install or repair fencing for an amount not to exceed \$457,188.70 as shown on the attached Exhibit A. The project award includes Alternates A-D and will be completed in October 2024. Funding for this project comes from the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) allocated to the City of Reno for Virginia Range Horses Fencing and Contingency Funds.

Budgeted funds and encumbrances are shown in the table below:



<u>Horse Protection Project South Phase</u> – Staff is working with the Nevada Department of Transportation (NDOT) on an interlocal agreement for funding of fencing and cattleguard installation along and across Geiger Grade with the goal of having a barrier along the Virginia Range extending south to Toll Road. The exact location of fencing is to be determined by working with NDOT, Washoe County, and the Nevada Department of Agriculture (NDA). The interlocal agreement is tentatively scheduled for the

September 25, 2024, City Council agenda.

Staff is also working with J-U-B Engineers on developing a conceptual plan for watering sites up on the range between Alexander Lake Road and Damonte Ranch High School to reduce the physical need for the horses to come down into the urban area.
