

COMBUSTIBLE DUST-PRODUCING OPERATIONS



OPERATIONAL PERMIT INFORMATION SHEET

This Permit issued and accepted on condition that all provisions of the Codes now adopted, or that may hereafter be adopted, shall be complied with.

- Smoking or the use of heating or other devices employing an open flame, or the use of spark producing equipment is prohibited in areas where combustible dust is generated, stored, manufactured, processed or handled.
- Accumulation of combustible dust shall be kept to a minimum in the interior of buildings.
- Accumulated combustible dust shall be collected by vacuum cleaning or other means that will not place combustible dust into suspension in air. Forced air or similar methods shall not be used to remove dust from surfaces.
- Refer to Chapter 22 of the 2018 International Fire Code for applicable standards regarding particular types of combustible dust producing operations. Additional requirements are subject to inspection and review.

The applicant accepts responsibility for the use of this Permit, in full compliance with the terms and conditions above, and additionally hereby to assume, pay and hold the City of Reno harmless for any liability arising out of the Permit. This Permit does not take the place of any license required by law and is not transferable. Any change in the use or occupancy of premises shall require a new permit.
