

Cryogenic Fluids



OPERATIONAL PERMIT INFORMATION SHEET

This Permit issued and accepted on condition that all provisions of the Codes now adopted, or that may hereafter be adopted, shall be complied with.

- Only approved containers shall be employed for the storage or use of cryogenic fluids.
- Approved pressure relief devices and piping shall be provided and maintained to protect containers and systems containing cryogenic fluids from rupture in the event of over-pressure.
- Buildings or areas in which cryogenic fluids are stored, handled or used shall be provided with visible NFPA 704 placard signs at entrances.
- Stationary and portable containers shall be marked with the name of the gas contained.
- Cryogenic containers and systems shall be marked as specified in Chapter 55 of the 2018 International Fire Code.
- Cryogenic containers and systems shall be secured against accidental dislodgement and against access by unauthorized personnel.
- Cryogenic containers and systems shall be separated from materials and conditions which pose exposure hazards to or from each other.
- Cryogenic containers and systems shall be located in approved areas only.
- Leaking, damaged, or corroded containers shall be removed from service.
- Design, construction, location, storage, use, and handling shall be as approved during building permit plans process. Any change will require re-submittal of plans.
- Cryogenic fluids must comply with all applicable provisions of the 2018 International Fire Code, particularly Chapter 55. Additional requirements are subject to inspection and review.

The applicant accepts responsibility for the use of this Permit, in full compliance with the terms and conditions above, and additionally hereby to assume, pay and hold the City of Reno harmless for any liability arising out of the Permit. This Permit does not take the place of any license required by law and is not transferable. Any change in the use or occupancy of premises shall require a new permit.
