

DRY CLEANING PLANTS



OPERATIONAL PERMIT INFORMATION SHEET

This Permit issued and accepted on condition that all provisions of the Codes now adopted, or that may hereafter be adopted, shall be complied with.

- Types I, II and III solvents will be limited to one gallon at any workstation.
- Scouring, brushing, spotting, and pre-treating shall be conducted with Type II or III solvent dispensed from safety cans.
- Dry cleaning by immersion and agitation in open vessels is prohibited.
- All materials to be dry cleaned shall be thoroughly searched in the receiving room and all foreign materials, especially matches and metallic substances, shall be removed.
- All employees shall be informed of the hazards of the solvents and processes used and trained in the proper storage, handling, use, and disposal of materials and wastes.
- Lint and refuse shall be removed from all traps daily and disposed of safely.
- Proper maintenance and operating practices to prevent leakage or unintentional escape of solvent or solvent vapors shall be followed. Spills shall be cleaned up immediately.
- Ventilation and exhaust systems shall be maintained.
- Flammable and combustible liquids shall not be used for cleaning up floors.
- All dry-cleaning machines and conversions shall be furnished with nameplates indicating warnings regarding minimum solvent flash point, maximum rated cylinder speed, and date of manufacture or conversion.
- All other equipment shall be suitably rated, constructed, and tested for the materials and pressures they will be operating under. Documentation shall be available for inspection.
- All fire protection equipment shall be maintained. Fire extinguishers shall have current tags and be readily available.
- All dry-cleaning facilities must comply with all applicable sections of the 2018 International Fire Code, particularly Chapter 21, and NFPA 32. Additional requirements are subject to inspection and review.

The applicant accepts responsibility for the use of this Permit, in full compliance with the terms and conditions above, and additionally hereby to assume, pay and hold the City of Reno harmless for any liability arising out of the Permit. This Permit does not take the place of any license required by
